

What a Wonderful World

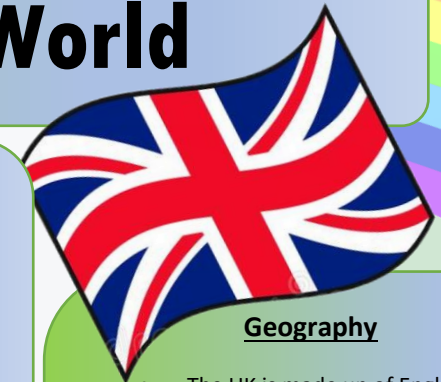
• Key Vocabulary
