HISTORY

Charles Darwin was born in Shrewsbury, England in 1809.

He set sail aboard HMS Beagle on the 27th December 1831 on a five-year voyage.

The captain of the Beagle was Robert Fitzroy.

They travelled to South America, the Galapagos Islands Australia and South Africa.

He discovered unique animals (giant tortoise and blue-footed booby) on the Galapagos Islands that helped him to develop his theory.

Darwin's book was called "On the Origin of the Species".

Darwin's theory of Evolution through natural selection was controversial at the time. Over millions of years, living organisms have changed in order to adapt to their habitat. Those that adapt the best, reproduce allowing the species to survive (survival of the fittest).

Sources of information can be unreliable so when researching I need to double check facts by looking at more than one source.

KEY VOCABULARY

Archipelago: a group of islands that formed from the same source.

Tropics: the regions of the Earth surrounding the Equator, bound by two lines of latitude.

Latitude: the distance north or south of the Equator, measured in degrees.

Evolution: the process by which living organisms have developed from earlier forms.

Adaptation: the process of change by which and living organism becomes better suited to its environment.

Organism: any living thing, made up of one or more cells.
